STAGE TWO: MALDON TO MALDON

The Ford RideLondon Classique, one of the world's leading professional women's bike races, returns to Essex on Saturday 25 May.

The second stage of the 2024 race will start and finish in Maldon. The race will head north towards Abberton Reservoir and Tiptree before completing circuits that will see riders pass Witham, Little Baddow and Maldon three times. The full map is provided over the page.

The race will feature the world's best female cyclists and be screened live on the BBC.

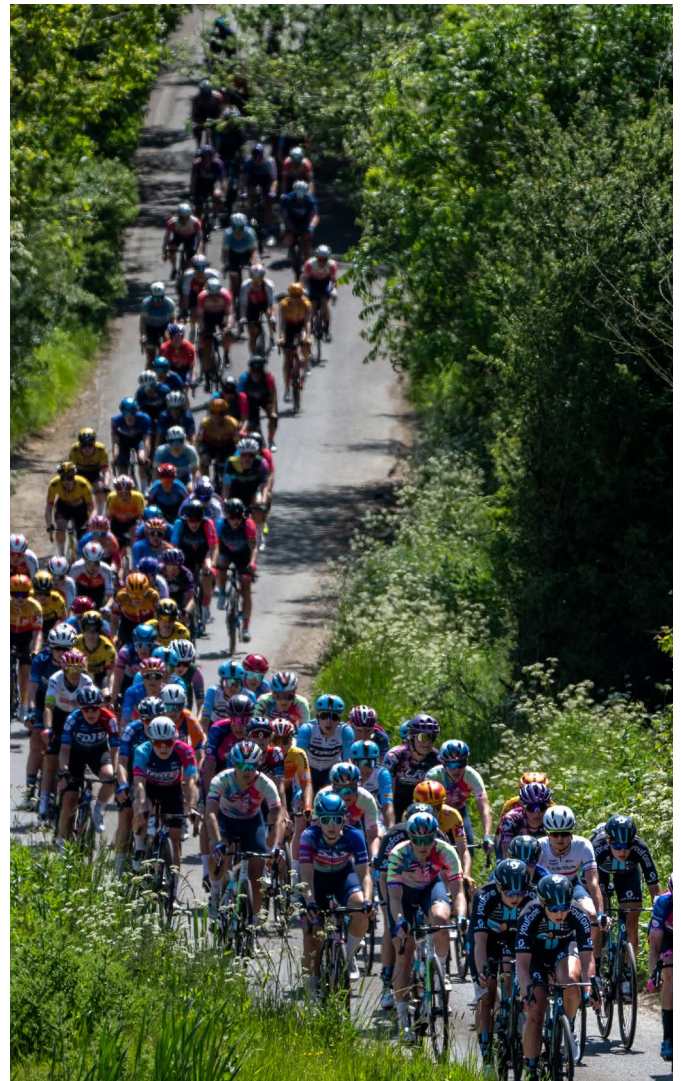

The Start:
 Stage Two will start in Promenade Park, Maldon, at **11:00**. The riders roll out of the park and along Maldon High Street before leaving the town via Market Hill. To prepare for this the stretch of Mill Road and High Street between Promenade Park and Market Hill will be closed between **10:45** and **11:15**.

The Finish:
 The Stage Two finish will be on Maldon High Street, close to All Saints' Church. To prepare for the race and to remove infrastructure afterwards, Maldon High Street between Market Hill and Spital Road will be closed between **04:00** and **20:00**.

Roads will be closed on a temporary basis for a period of approximately 30 minutes within each predicted road closure window listed above.
